The bottom line is, we will all need to pay a bit more for membership and boat storage to keep the society afloat, if we don't, we WILL LOSE the club hut and compound. That would be the first time in 111 years that the Felixstowe Sea Angling Society did not have a headquarters - let's all avoid that at all costs. I'm now a pensioner but would happily pay double to ensure the survival of the society.

Secretary's Report 2019/2020

Just before we were locked down in March this year, we managed to get the Clubhouse doors, soffits, down pipes, guttering, and bargeboards replaced. This was with the financial help of a £1750.00 grant from Felixstowe Town Council and the installation of soffits, bargeboards etc by two of our club members Shane Baxter and Robin Smith. A big thank you to them. The front door and fire door were installed by Kirton Windows.

I am currently in contact with East Suffolk Council regarding the renewal of our 10-year lease for the club compound which expired in December last year. We have yet to sign it as I had several questions to be answered with wording in certain areas of the new lease. We did not receive it until the beginning of June which was mainly due to Council staff not being available because of Covid-19. One thing that they will not budge on is the price increase of the new lease which has gone up by a massive 27% compared to last year. When we do get to pay it will cost us £3,320. We can cover the rent this year but next year our average club income will not be sufficient to meet all outgoings. We need to raise our boat storage fees which have remained the same for the past 9 years. Can I draw your attention to the attached proposal which has already been discussed at committee level and must be voted on by the club members. Even with the proposed price increase we are still cheaper than anywhere else considering the facilities that our Clubhouse has to offer i.e. power, water, toilet, and kitchen.

Finally, I would like to thank the committee for all the support they have given over the past year and I am willing to stand again for re-election as Secretary if the membership is happy for me to do so. I wish everyone a good 2020 – 2021 fishing season and hopefully at some point Covid-19 restriction free!

Competition / Match Secretary's Report 2019 - 2020

Here we are again taken time to look back on the past disrupted season due to the Covid pandemic,

We were the last club to stop matches and one of the first to restart under new systems.

This has meant we made the decision to not fish for the Spring cup, Borley Tuesday evening cup and the Knock out cup, any monies paid for the KO cup will be transferred to next season, unless you wish to have it back.

Looking at the matches we did fish, 23 fished at Sizewell in January which was also the 1st leg of the interclub with Suffolk sports cast, that was a good match, with some close results.

We have seen some close leagues results as well this year, most of the cups could have gone anyway at the last match, that must mean the format is correct, you can still win a cup at the last match, even if you have not won a match, but you have had a steady run in the other matches.

Take time to see were you have come in the cups (Spread sheets attached) and reflect on the if's and if only.

Turner shield was won by Bruce Lawrence, great tactical win with Whiting and dogs where some fished for Rays which did not show up, runner up was the Trophy hunter himself Sam Creasey, deprived again by his old mate.

Boxing Day match was again fished in the viewing area, won by Andy Smith again, retaining his title, getting the hot spot and converting it into a win, runner up was the Trophy hunter deprived again, couple of nice flounders also turned up at this match.

Christmas Match was Won by Our Chairman Roger Mortimore a nice Ray helped roger stagger home with the hamper, last seasons winner Bob Foster was piped at the post so could not retain the tile and had to settle for 2nd this year.

Junior Winner was young Walter Creasey, beating his dad to claim a trophy before he had, can't wait to see his face when he gets the cup.

But Sam did not have to wait long and went all out to win the **Neville Banham cup**, winning with a fantastic 24 fish for 157pts, Well done Sam great 1st Cup, and well done I know how hard you have fished to win a cup at the club, (But then again so do 1,000's on Facebook).

This is what I think this club is all about, no big cash prizes, raw competition and a desire to compete and become better Anglers.

Easter match, was not fished due to covid.

Top catch was 13lb 7 by Myself in the 1st leg of the Presidents cup, this also included the **Biggest fish** of the year a ray at 52 cm which was also weighed at 6lb 7

But there were some other matches and fish that went close,

2nd leg of the Presidents cup was won by Richard Burrow with 12lb 1, Roger Mortimore had 2 rays in daylight on Landguard one at 51cm (260pts,5lb 4) and 622 pts (12lb 10) Jason also had a ray on the Tuesday night match in September at 51cm and Bob Foster had one at 49cm.

Other matches also had some good results;

Tuesday night matches, Butts in October saw Camron Turner nick the win From Ste Adams by a few points with 551 to 541. Dip in November 616pts (12lb 8) made up of 32 sizeable whiting for myself, and the last match in January saw us side by side fishing in the viewing area, not a great match for fish but a good fun match any one could have won.

Away cup – so we could conclude this cup the 3 matches after the restrictions where eased where for this cup, Andy won at Eastlane with 2 dogfish, Dale Pegg found 2 lovely sole and a eel to take the 2nd win at the Dip the 3rd match won by Andy also doubled up as the sole match won by Jason.

The noteworthy fish cup was awarded to Roger Mortimore with a Dab of 34 cm, good Dab from the beach.

Next season

Fixtures are done, You will notice some reduced changes, this season some of the one off matches will also count as league and cup matches, i.e. the Turner Shield will also count for the Rosebowl 1st leg and we have also reduced the number of matches to 3 and not 4 for the Rose bowl, Away cup and the Spring cup. This is hoped to help with number of matches in the area, and also help in the changing world we live in.

Cups and points will be on the same lines, i.e. 12 for a win,10 for 2nd and 8,7,6,5,4,3,2 if you catch and 1 if you blank, fish points will splint any tie's on points.

Cod Rover is still hanging in hopping for a cod to return, if not the match becomes a biggest 2 fish match which is also good fun, you can win 1st as well as both biggest fish!

I will review as the year goes on and might add a couple of fun matches in like the rockling challenge or a species hunt where everything count, but it is worth pointing out when I say reduce numbers it still leaves 25 matches to fish, would have been 32 if not.

I am always keen to increase numbers at matches, and have run the league's i.e. **Away cup / Rose Bowl** as suggested, holding back £1 per person and pay out 1st and 2nd overall, this worked well and plan to keep doing it, We hope to still arrange a presentation of some sorts, details near the time.

Well done to all the Match winners, some new names, some 1st ever wins as well, and well done for just turning up and supporting the Club.
